Chief Complaint

Patient is a 57 year old male. His reason for visit is "I had a cold two weeks ago and still have a cough".

History of Present Illness

#1. "cough"

Quality

He reported: Green sputum. Thick sputum.
He denied: Hemoptysis.

Severity

He reported: Continuous cough. Able to speak 2 to 3 words between breaths.

Duration

He reported: Cough 11 to 15 days.

Timing

He reported: Nocturnal cough.
He denied: Seasonal cough.

Context

He reported: Cough productive of sputum. Paroxysmal cough. Pleuritic chest pain.
He denied: Cough onset after med change.

Modifying Factors

He denied: Cough worse post exertion and worse recumbent.

Associated Signs and Symptoms

He reported: Dyspnea associated with chest pain. Wheezing. Dyspnea. Recent coryza improved then worsened.
He denied: Dyspnea associated with paresthesia, diaphoresis, and cyanosis.

Past, Family, and Social History

Past Medical History

History of: Pneumonia.
He denied: Sinusitis. Seasonal allergies.

Social History

He denied: Cough associated with history of exposure to birds.

Activities for Daily Living

He denied: Dyspnea interferes with activities of daily living.

Tobacco Use

History of: Smoking cigarettes every day now. Smoked cigarettes more than 20 years. 31-40 cigarettes (2 packs) smoked per day.

Review of Systems

Constitutional

He reported: Cough associated with fever. Fever 3 to 4 days and associated with rigor. Highest fever 102.2F or 39C.
He denied: Night sweats. Diaphoresis associated with fever.

Ear, Nose, and Throat

He reported: Postnasal drainage. Rhinorrhea 1 week to 3 weeks and thin. White nasal drainage.
He denied: Cough associated with hoarseness. Nasal congestion. Auditory loss. Facial pain. Otagia. Sore throat. Otorrhea. Cervical adenopathy.

Cardiovascular

He denied: Chest pain radiates to left arm, neck, jaw, teeth, and the back.
Suffocating orthopnea.

Musculoskeletal

He denied: Myalgias.

Neurological

He denied: Headache associated with illness.
